**St. Jane Frances de Chantal** is a Roman Catholic saint, who was beatified in 1751 and canonized in 1767. She founded the religious Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary.

**The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary** into Heaven is, according to the beliefs of the Catholic Church, Eastern and Oriental Orthodoxy, the bodily taking up of the Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life.

**SS Pontian and Hippolytus'** Story. Two men died for the faith after harsh treatment and exhaustion in the mines of Sardinia. One had been pope for five years, the other an antipope for 18. They died reconciled. Pontian was a Roman who served as pope from 230 to 235.

**St. Stephen I of Hungary**, also known as King Saint Stephen, was the last Grand Prince of the Hungarians between 997 and 1000 or 1001, and the first King of Hungary from 1000 or 1001 until his death in 1038. The year of his birth is uncertain, but many details of his life suggest that he was born in or after 975 in Esztergom. Although both of his parents were baptized, Stephen was the first member of his family to become a devout Christian. He married Gisela of Bavaria, a scion of the imperial Ottonian dynasty.

**Maximilian Maria Kolbe OFM Conv.**, a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar, volunteered to die in place of a stranger in the German death camp of Auschwitz, located in German-occupied Poland during World War II. He had been active in promoting the veneration of the Immaculate Virgin Mary, founding and supervising the monastery of Niepokalanów near Warsaw, operating an amateur-radio station, and founding or running several other organizations and publications.

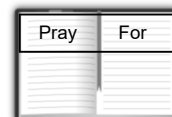

## **This School Is Fully Staffed!**

As of last Wednesday, we are fully staffed for this upcoming school year. Not only are we fully staffed, but we are staffed with incredible people who are passionate for our faith, strong in their professionalism, and care for children. ## **First Day of School – Red Carpet Ceremony:**

The first day of school is an exciting day! Help us open our school year by attending our Red Carpet Ceremony at 8:10 am on Monday August 12<sup>th</sup>. On this first day, families should plan on arriving between 7:45 and 8:05 am. Parents are invited and encouraged to park and join their child(ren) on the Great Lawn. Each teacher will be holding a sign identifying themselves and their grade level. Please find your teacher on the field. Between 8:05 and 8:10, we will assemble by grade level on the south side of the field. At about 8:15, students will be welcomed to the school, we will pray, and then we will cut the red ribbon to open the school for the year. Once this happens, each class of students led by their teacher will walk into the school on a “red carpet” and into the school being greeted by the Principal and staff. Parents please be sure to be here between 7:45 and 8:05 on this first day and please consider joining us as we celebrate the start of the school year.

## **Holy Day of Obligation:**

Thursday, August 15<sup>th</sup> is a Holy Day of Obligation as we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lady of the Assumption. Typically, we would have Mass on Wednesday but due to the Holy Day, we will not go to Mass as a school on Wednesday, August 14<sup>th</sup> but attend Mass as a school on Thursday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Students should dress in Mass day attire on Thursday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. Please consider joining us for this important celebration.

As a Catholic community, it is crucial that we come together as a community to give thanks and praise God. We will continue to have weekly Mass as a community on Wednesdays at 8:30 am. # LITURGY CORNER

## **FAITH AND HOPE**

Faith and hope are closely united in today's readings. The Israelites knew when the Passover was coming, and so were not in fear, but had faith and courage, "putting into effect with one accord the divine institution." In this we can see a foretelling of the Eucharist that we celebrate according to Christ's command, "Do this in memory of me."

We see that Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, and Jacob died in faith, although they did not see fulfillment of the promise. We live in hope that our faith will be fulfilled every time we celebrate this sacrament. We too are not to be afraid, but to have hope that our faith will be fulfilled in the coming of Christ.

## **TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agagianian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed!

También vela por sus almas dándoles una formación total de cuerpo, alma y espíritu.

En fin, el Hogar de Cristo se dedica a difundir la realidad de los pobres por medio de nuestro llamado bautismal a la responsabilidad que tenemos en darle al Hijo de hombre un lugar para reclinar su cabeza.


