<p>Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church In Roman Catholic Mariology, Mother of the Church is a title, officially given to Mary during the Second Vatican Council by Pope Paul VI. The title was first used in the 4th century by Saint Ambrose of Milan, as rediscovered by Hugo Rahner.</p>	<p>St. Anthony of Padua born Fernando Martins de Bulhões - also known as Saint Anthony of Lisbon - was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church on 16 January 1946. He is also the patron saint of lost things.</p>
<p>St. Barnabus born Joseph, was according to tradition an early Christian, one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. According to Acts 4:36, Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. Named an apostle in Acts 14:14, he and Paul the Apostle undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against the Judaizers. They traveled together making more converts, and participated in the Council of Jerusalem. Barnabas and Paul successfully evangelized among the "God-fearing" Gentiles who attended synagogues in various Hellenized cities of Anatolia.</p>	<p>Pentecost Sunday The Christian holy day of Pentecost, which is celebrated on the seventh Sunday after Easter, commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles. In Christian tradition, this event represents the birth of the early Church.</p>

Pentecost is a celebration of both the gift of the Spirit and the effects of that gift - we are sharers in the one body of Christ who take up Jesus' mission to preach the good news of salvation. 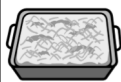

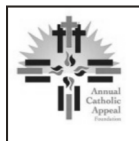

Our assessment for 2019 is \$63,000. Your continued support is greatly appreciated.

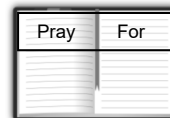
COMMUNION THOUGHTFULNESS

ADULT CONFIRMATION

Preparation for Adult Confirmation will begin on **WEDNESDAY**, August 28 from 6:30 pm to 8:45 pm in the Merrifield Room of the Parish Office. Classes are for those **19** years or older who are **baptized Catholic** and have **made their First Communion---** but have not been Confirmed. Classes continue on Wednesdays until November 6 and attendance of all classes is required unless excused. Confirmation will be Wednesday, October 30 at 6:00 pm. **If you are married, you must be married in the Catholic Church by a Priest or Deacon and be able to provide verification of this marriage.** Please contact Deacon Jack Granato at 271-0551 or 459-9010 for more information. SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION

The Archdiocese of Santa Fe has instituted a policy requiring all employees and volunteers 18 years of age or older and involved in any parish ministry or school volunteer to take the Abuse Awareness class every five (5) years. **If it has been five years or greater since you have taken this class, you are required to attend a class offered at the Catholic Center or complete the online course.** Please connect to the Archdiocese of Santa Fe website at the following address: <https://www.archdiosf.org/victims-assistance>. Scroll down to the middle of the page for the schedule of classes or alternatively to take the online class scroll to the bottom of the page and on the left hand side under Links; click on Virtus Online English or Spanish. The first step is to create a user ID and password, the second step you will request your background check. Once that is complete, you can continue on with the class which can take anywhere from one to three hours. If you cannot complete the class, you can log off and sign in at a later time and the class will continue where you left off. Upon completion of the class, please print two certificates, one for your files and one to be submitted to the Parish office. LITURGY CORNER

RECONCILED DIVERSITY

A few years ago, during Rome's quiet summer, Pope Francis took a day off to visit privately with some old friends, whose identity took Catholic Italy by surprise: Evangelical Protestants. They welcomed Francis to their Pentecostal Church of Reconciliation, where Francis asked pardon for Catholic persecutions and celebrated the Holy Spirit's "Pentecostal work." Unlike Satan, declared Francis, who creates division among God's children, the Holy Spirit creates a diversity rich and beautiful. And unity; not uniformity, Francis specified, but unity in diversity. Francis named the Spirit's gift "reconciled diversity." Pentecost's rich treasury of scriptural readings, for Saturday's vigil and Sunday's morning liturgy, traces the Holy Spirit's work from creation's beginning, through Jesus' resurrection, into the church's earliest days, now into our days. Kindled in our hearts, the Spirit's gentle fire is ours to share generously, even with those most strikingly different from us. All hearts are Spirit-warmed by reconciled diversity.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we are at the fiftieth day of the Easter celebration: seven weeks of seven days, a week of weeks, now culminating in a festival fiftieth day. While the liturgical color of the Easter season is gold, on this last day we have red. For the first thousand years of the church, there were no firm rules for using colors. Only wealthy churches could afford a full array of colors, and most places used the best vestments, no matter the color, for the greatest feasts. The Church spelled out an exact plan for color, including red for Pentecost, only in 1570, but local differences held on until the 1800s.

Color experts tell us that red is a hot color, best used for fast-paced, upbeat, active experiences. It is hard to be neutral before red, as any matador will tell you. It invites commitment, draws you in. It is a stimulating color, engaging the eye, stirring hunger. It is the most fitting color for this day when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit into our lives, a dynamic presence overturning neutrality in favor of passion and commitment.

COME TO US, SPIRIT OF HOLINESS

Holy Spirit,
you banish fear from our hearts;
you bear witness in us that we are children of God;
we pray to you:
Remove from our hearts the spirit of slaves;
place in us the spirit of adopted children
to make us cry out, "Abba, Father!"

DIVERSIDAD RECONCILIADA

Hace algunos años, durante un verano tranquilo en Roma, el Papa Francisco tomó un día de descanso para pasar un tiempo en privado con algunos viejos amigos, cuyas identidades tomaron por sorpresa a los católicos italianos: protestantes evangélicos. Ellos dieron la bienvenida a Francisco a su iglesia pentecostal de la reconciliación, donde Francisco pidió perdón por las persecuciones católicas y celebró "la obra pentecostal" del Espíritu Santo. Francisco declaró que Satanás crea división en medio de los hijos de Dios, pero el Espíritu Santo crea una diversidad rica y hermosa. Y unidad, pero no uniformidad, Francisco especificó, sino unidad en la diversidad. Francisco nombró el don del Espíritu Santo "diversidad reconciliada". El rico tesoro de Pentecostés de las lecturas de las Escrituras, para la vigilia del sábado y la liturgia del domingo por la mañana, rastrea la obra del Espíritu Santo desde el comienzo de la creación, mediante la resurrección de Jesús, hacia los primeros días de la Iglesia, ahora en nuestros días. Encerrados en nuestros corazones, el fuego gentil del Espíritu es nuestro para compartir generosamente, incluso con aquellos que son notablemente diferentes a nosotros. Todos los corazones son estimulados por la diversidad reconciliada.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Hoy celebramos la Pascua de Pentecostés. Esta es una de las tres Pascuas que celebramos los cristianos. Las otras dos son la Pascua de Resurrección (o Pascua Florida) y la Pascua del Nacimiento de Jesús. Estas tres solemnidades cristianas celebran tres momentos claves en el plan de salvación: la Encarnación del Verbo Divino (Jesús), su Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección y el descenso de su Espíritu Santo sobre la Iglesia. Pascua viene siendo el nombre de la principal solemnidad del calendario judío y recuerda la liberación del pueblo de Israel de la esclavitud. Los cristianos hemos tomado ese nombre por reconocernos como descendientes de Abraham y porque en nuestras tres pascuas celebramos que Jesús viene a salvarnos, o sea, a liberarnos del pecado y sus consecuencias tanto personales como sociales. En muchas partes el título de Pascua se ha dejado para hablar de la Fiesta de la Navidad y la Fiesta de Pentecostés. Esto es una lástima ya que el recordar la Pascua debe impulsar al cristiano a obrar por la liberación de todos para que el mundo se salve por Jesucristo.
