GRACE AND ETERNAL LIFE

Moses is a man after our own hearts, for haven't we all dealt with more than our share of stiff-necked people? Indeed, haven't we all gotten a little stiff-necked ourselves at times? Complaining . . . impatient . . . quick to anger. How lucky for Moses - how lucky for all of us - that God is exactly the opposite! And we don't even have to guess about it. The Lord tells us so directly. Accordingly, Moses does what we all need to do. Even with the tablets in hand, he bows down and asks for God's forgiveness and grace.

Encouraging us to live together in peace - and in God's favor - the Apostle Paul knows all about this grace, joyfully invoking Christ's grace on us along with God's love and the Holy Spirit's. "Rejoice," he says. And when it comes to rejoicing, John offers us the gladdest words of all: the assurance of eternal life through Jesus.

SAINT EPHREM (306-373)

June 9

He was born in present-day Turkey, the son of a pagan priest and a Christian mother. From an early age he showed an explosive temperament, which he learned to control. As a young man he was baptized and was subsequently ordained a deacon. His ministry was dedicated to the teaching of the faith, for he was a great teacher. His bishop, noticing his Christian and human qualities, wanted to ordain him a priest, but Ephrén objected because he regarded the priesthood as unworthy to him. As a deacon and teacher he disseminated Christian teaching with extraordinary qualities of writer, making use of poetry, religious songs or, parodying the lyrics of the popular songs of his time to not only challenge Christian heresies, but also, to propagate the teachings of Christ. History distinguishes it with the nickname "The Zither of the Holy Spirit". With his poetry he was the founder of a theological school. Although he did not speak Greek, he was bold in his language, writing poems dedicated to Mary, Mother of God. His writings and mysticism made him one of the Doctors of the Church.

GRACIA Y VIDA ETERNA

Moisés es un hombre como nosotros, ¿acaso no hemos tratado también con cabezas duras? De hecho, ¿acaso no hemos sido nosotros mismos los cabezas duras? Quejumbrosos. . . impacientes. . . rápidos para enojarnos. ¡Qué suerte la de Moisés y qué suerte la nuestra que Dios es precisamente lo opuesto! Y ni siquiera tenemos que adivinarlo. El Señor nos lo dice directamente. Y en concordancia, Moisés hace lo que todos necesitamos hacer. Pese a tener las tablas en las manos, se postra y pide el perdón y la gracia de Dios.

Alentándonos a vivir juntos en paz y con el favor de Dios, el apóstol Pablo sabe de esta gracia, e invoca con alegría la gracia del amor de Dios y del Espíritu Santo sobre nosotros. "Estén alegres", dice. Y cuando se trata de alegrarnos, Juan nos ofrece las palabras más regocijantes: la seguridad de la vida eterna en Jesús.

EFRÉN (c. 306-373)

9 de junio

Nació en la actual Turquía, hijo de un sacerdote pagano y de madre cristiana. Desde muy pequeño mostró un temperamento explosivo, mismo que aprendió a controlar. Siendo muy joven se hizo bautizar y posteriormente fue ordenado diácono. Su ministerio estuvo dedicado a la enseñanza de la fe, pues era un gran maestro. Su obispo, notando sus cualidades cristianas y humanas, quiso ordenarlo sacerdote, pero Efrén se opuso pues consideraba el sacerdocio como algo indigno para él. Como diácono y maestro difundió la enseñanza cristiana con cualidades extraordinarias de escritor, haciendo uso de la poesía, los cantos religiosos o bien, parodiando la letra de los cantos populares de su tiempo para no sólo rebatir las herejías cristianas, sino también, para propagar las enseñanzas de Cristo. La historia lo distingue con el mote de "La cítara del Espíritu Santo". Con su poesía fue fundador de una escuela teológica. Pese a que no hablaba el griego, fue audaz en su idioma, escribiendo poemas dedicados a María, Madre de Dios. Sus escritos y misticismo hicieron de él uno de los Doctores de la Iglesia.

Trinity Sunday is celebrated in all the Western liturgical churches: Latin Catholic, Anglican, Lutheran, Presbyterian, United Church of Christ, and Methodist. "Ordinary Time, meaning ordered or numbered time, is celebrated in two segments: from the Monday following the Baptism of Our Lord up to Ash Wednesday; and from Pentecost Monday to the First Sunday of Advent." Sundays and weeks of the liturgical year are numbered continuously from the beginning of Ordinary Time. This makes it the largest season of the Liturgical Year. In the revised Roman rite, Ordinary Time resumes one week earlier, on the Monday after Pentecost, with the Sundays that would otherwise fall on Pentecost and Trinity Sunday omitted that year. The liturgical color used on Trinity Sunday is white. In the Catholic Church it is officially known as the *Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity*. Prior to the reforms of the Second Vatican Council, it marked the end of a three-week period when church weddings were forbidden. The period began on the fifth Sunday after Easter. Trinity Sunday was established as a Double of the Second Class by Pope John XXII to celebrate the Trinity. It was raised to the dignity of a Double of the First Class by Pope Pius X on July 4, 1911. During the Middle Ages, especially during the Carolingian period, devotion to the Blessed Trinity was a highly important feature of private devotion and inspired several liturgical expressions. The currently prescribed liturgical color is white.

St. Anthony of Padua, also known as Anthony of Lisbon, was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church on January 6, 1946. He is also the patron saint of lost things.

St. Barnabas: born Joseph, was according to tradition an early Christian, one of the prominent Christian disciples in Jerusalem. According to Acts 4:36, Barnabas was a Cypriot Jew. Named an apostle in Acts 14:14, he and Paul the Apostle undertook missionary journeys together and defended Gentile converts against the Judaizers. They traveled together making more converts (c. 45–47), and participated in the Council of Jerusalem (c. 50). Barnabas and Paul successfully evangelized among the "God-fearing" Gentiles who attended synagogues in various Hellenized cities of Anatolia. Barnabas' story appears in the Acts of the Apostles, and Paul mentions him in some of his epistles. Tertullian named him as the author of the Epistle to the Hebrews, but this and other attributions are conjecture. Clement of Alexandria and some scholars have ascribed the Epistle of Barnabas to him, but his authorship is disputed. Although the date, place, and circumstances of his death are historically unverifiable, Christian tradition holds that Barnabas was martyred at Salamis, Cyprus, in 61 AD. He is traditionally identified as the founder of the Cypriot Orthodox Church. The feast day of Barnabas is celebrated on June 11. Barnabas is usually identified as the cousin of Mark the Evangelist on the basis of the term "anepsios" used in Colossians 4, which carries the connotation of "cousin." Some traditions hold that Aristobulus of Britannia, one of the Seventy Disciples, was the brother of Barnabas. Acts 11:24 describes Barnabas as "a good man, and full of the Holy Spirit and of faith".

FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

Mass in Church during COVID Pandemic: 1st Phase of Return 1 (Version of May 14, 2020)

These directives are promulgated by the Archbishop of Santa Fe for the early lifting of the suspension of publicly-attended Mass:

- No open holy water present. There may be a dispenser for people to fill bottles if desired.
- Wipe down commonly-touched items such as pews, chairs, ambos, hand rails, door handles, etc. between Masses. Prop open doors if possible.
- Remove missalettes/hymnals and worship aids; these are vehicles for contamination.
- Remember that live streaming music requires a separate license.
- Restrooms to be disinfected after each liturgy, with disinfecting supplies also available for persons utilizing the facilities.
- Map out seating/give assignments with at least 6 ft distance between families in all directions. This may require roping off some pews.
- Consider reservations/revised capacity, and persons must sit where directed in clearly marked designated seats. They may not be able to get their "regular" place. Ushers will be needed to direct them.
- Cry rooms to be closed; inform families beforehand.
- Those of the same household sit together.
- Dispensation from Sunday obligation remains for all.
- Safety/ common good is priority.
- Persons over 60 and with compromised immune systems should be pre-advised that they are at increased risk and be encouraged to remain home.

Individual Responsibility

- Sick/symptomatic stay home, as well as those with health vulnerabilities or weakened immune systems.
