GOD'S WORDS

Each day we are bombarded with thousands of words. From the moment our clock radios click on in the morning, until the last moment of the day when the television is turned off or someone bids us "good-night," our life is filled with words. Some words that we hear bring news that leaves us feeling low. Some words lift our spirits. Many of the words we hear are trying to get us to buy something. Some words are hurtful. Today the Church focuses our attention on hearing the word of God. Are God's words just more of the same - part of the endless stream of words that flow into our ears each day? The challenge today is to allow God's word to inspire us in new ways so that our outlook and attitudes align themselves more closely with the heart and mind of Christ Jesus.

SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680) **July 14**

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville - Osserson to Native Americans - in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does "the aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel?

LAS PALABRAS DE DIOS

Cada día somos bombardeados por miles de palabras. SAN ENRIQUE (972-1024) **13 de julio**

Enrique nació en Alemania y desde pequeño fue educado por el obispo Wolfango, quien le ayudó a abrir su conciencia respecto a los pobres y a las necesidades de otros pueblos. Años después se casó con Cunegunda de Luxemburgo, pero debido a una enfermedad renal, nunca pudieron tener hijos. A los 34 años fue nombrado rey de Alemania y como tal fue ejemplar en el cuidado de los pobres y la lucha contra la opresión, así como la construcción y renovación de los monasterios en Alemania. Su caridad fue tan grande que su cuñado, molesto porque daba todo a los pobres, organizó un golpe militar, pero fue sometido por el rey, quien les perdonó la ofensa. En el año 1014 fue coronado Emperador del Sacro Imperio Romano Germánico (Alemania, Austria, Suiza, Bélgica, Holanda y el Norte de Italia), pues tenía el cariño de la gente y la confianza del Papa. La gente apreciaba su santidad y el corazón de un gobernante que busca el bien de su pueblo. Fue canonizado en 1146 y su esposa, Santa Cunegunda, en 1200.

CATHOLIC TV MASS in ENGLISH

The Catholic Center St. Joseph/St. Francis Chapel over the air television Sunday at 7:30 a.m. on FOX 2 American Sign Language (ASL) Interpreted.

St. Henry, was born in 972. He sought in all things, the greater glory of God. He was most watchful over the welfare of the Church and exerted his zeal for the maintenance of ecclesiastical discipline through the instrumentality of the Bishops. The humility and spirit of justice of the Saint were equal to his zeal for religion. Both he and his wife, St. Cunegundes, lived in perpetual chastity, to which they had bound themselves by vow. The Saint made numerous pious foundations, gave liberally to pious institutions and built the Cathedral of Bamberg. His holy death occurred at the castle of Grone, near Halberstad, in 1024. His feast day is July 13th. He is the patron saint of the childless, of Dukes, of the handicapped and those rejected by Religious Order.

St. Bonaventure, OFM born Giovanni di Fidanza, was an Italian medieval Franciscan, scholastic theologian and philosopher. The seventh Minister General of the Order of Friars Minor, he was also Cardinal Bishop of Albano. He was canonized on April 14, 1482 by Pope Sixtus IV and declared a Doctor of the Church in the year 1588 by Pope Sixtus V. He is known as the "Seraphic Doctor". Many writings believed in the Middle Ages to be his are now collected under the name Pseudo-Bonaventure.

MISA EN CASA

Our Lady of Mount Carmel is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century. They built in the midst of their hermitages a chapel which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, whom they conceived of in chivalric terms as the "Lady of the place." Our Lady of Mount Carmel was adopted in the 19th century as the patron saint of Chile, in South America.

St. Camillus de Lellis, M.I., was a Roman Catholic priest from Italy who founded the Camillians, a religious order dedicated to the care of the sick. He was beatified by Pope Benedict XIV in the year 1742, and canonized by him four years later in 1746. De Lellis is the patron saint of the sick, hospitals, nurses and physicians. His assistance is also invoked against gambling.

FROM THE ARCHDIOCESE

Reopening our church for public worship must include every precaution to eliminate a second wave of infection; consequently, the Archdiocese has established the following guidelines to protect you as well as our fellow parishioners.

Safest Practices for Attending Mass

Those feeling unwell or believe they may have been exposed to someone with COVID-19 should not attend Mass.

One should not attend Mass if he or she is experiencing any symptoms of illness, especially the following:

- A temperature above 100.4 F
- Cough or sore throat
- Shortness of breath
- Recent loss of smell or taste
- Chills, muscle aches, or gastrointestinal upset

If attending Mass, one must adhere to the following:

All parishioners must wear a mask.

Maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in the church or on church property.

Refrain from physical contact such as holding hands during the Our Father.

Choirs and singing will be held to a minimum.

Safest Practices for Receiving Communion

Newly available evidence shows that virus spreads quickly through oral secretions; therefore, communion is most safely received as follows:

Communion will be received in the hand.

Both the priest and the communicant will be wearing masks.

The priest and communicant will sanitize hands prior to distributing/receiving communion.

Communion lines will be avoided – wait for the usher to dismiss each row individually and communion will be distributed as you exit the Church.

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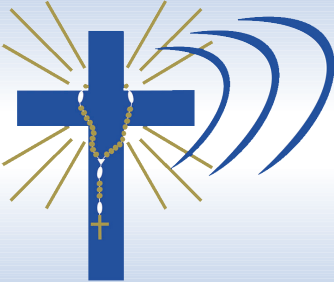
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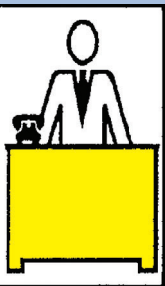
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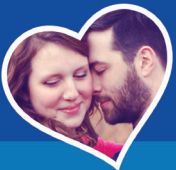

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
